

TOWN OF INDIAN HEAD

BYLAW NO. 2--1994

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF INDIAN HEAD TO ESTABLISH AND REGULATE THE COLLECTION, REMOVAL AND DISPOSAL OF ASHES, GARBAGE AND OTHER REFUSE. THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF INDIAN HEAD IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. A system for the collection, removal and disposal of ashes, garbage and other refuse accumulated within the Town of Indian Head limits as herein set forth, is hereby established and shall hereafter be operated as herein provided.
2. For the purposes of this bylaw, the following words shall have the meaning given herein:
 - a) "Ashes" shall mean the residue of any substance used as fuel;
 - b) "Garbage" means putrescible animal and vegetable remains and by-products resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking and consumption of food;
 - c) "Household Refuse" shall mean and include papers, magazines, bedding, mattresses, carpets, rags, clothing, boxes, tin cans, broken glass, bottles, tree branches, yard trimmings, and all similar substances that accumulate in or originate from a domestic household;
 - d) "Industrial Waste" means any waste generated by any process of industry, manufacturing, trade or business or the development of a natural resource.
 - e) "Demolition Material" shall mean and include materials from excavation, building construction, building repair or alternation, debris from any building removed, destroyed by fire or any other cause.
 - f) "Hazardous Waste" means a waste that:
 - (i) because of its quantity, concentration or physical, chemical or infectious characteristics, either individually or in combination with other wastes, is an existing or a potential threat to the environment, human health or other living organisms; and
 - (ii) is designated in the regulations to be hazardous waste.
 - g) "Owner" means the occupant, lessee or tenant or the person otherwise in charge of any dwelling, hotel or motel, restaurant, apartment block, office building, public institution or other premises.

- h) "Waste Disposal Ground" means the municipal waste disposal site located on SE-29-18-13-W2nd.
3. The Town of Indian Head shall employ or enter into a contract with such numbers of persons as may be deemed necessary, owning or possessing equipment, in the Councils opinion's reasonable adequate for the purposes required for the collection, removal and disposal of ashes, garbage and refuse accumulated in the Town of Indian Head as herein provided for.
 4. Garbage being accumulated and stored for the purpose of being collected and taken to a waste disposal ground for disposal shall be kept in covered, fly-proof and water tight containers, and the owner shall keep such containers in a place convenient for removal by the authorized person.
 5. The container shall be equipped with handles and shall not have a capacity greater than 75 litres by volume.
 6. The container for the reception of garbage shall be securely fastened on a stand or hanger and where a plastic bag is used as a container or liner, it shall be stored in a manner that will preclude it from being torn by animals and birds.
 7. Garbage shall be drained of liquid and shall be securely wrapped before it is placed in a container and such a container shall maintained by the occupant in a serviceable and sanitary condition.
 8. All refuse shall be properly removed by the owner of the land or premises where such originates or is accumulated to such place and at such time or times as may be designated by the Engineering Technologist.
 9. Ashes may be put in suitable, non-combustible containers or placed in a convenient place for collection.
 10. Subject to the provisions hereinafter set forth, rags, paper, including newspapers and periodicals, excelsior, cardboard cartons and other like material shall be securely tied in bundles and either placed in containers or placed adjacent to garbage receptacles for collection and removal.
 11. If the owner, after receiving notice from the Council to provide a proper garbage container or stand, neglects to do so, the Council may provide such container or stand at the expense of the owner.
 12. Where incineration is permitted by bylaw, residues shall be removed to a garbage receptacle not less than once a week.

13. Garbage or refuse, not placed in proper containers, or dealt with as herein provided, will not be picked up by the authorized person(s). Garbage and refuse allowed to accumulate through noncompliance with the regulations of this bylaw, will be removed by the Town of Indian Head at the expense of the owner.
14. Every vehicle used for the collection and transportation of ashes, garbage and refuse shall be suitably constructed and equipped with adequate covers to prevent loss of any part of the load enroute to the disposal grounds.
15. No person shall take to, or cause to be taken to, placed or dumped in waste disposal ground the following material:
 - a) any oil, or oil products or waste oil of any kind;
 - b) any used oil filters
 - c) paint or paint cans
 - d) pesticide containers
 - e) automobile bodies
 - f) asbestos material
 - g) industrial waste
 - h) hazardous waste
16. Elevator Dust Cleanings may be disposed of at the Indian Head Waste Disposal Grounds provide the disposal meets the guideline from Saskatchewan Environment Resource Management (SERM).
17. Any person wanting to haul garbage or refuse to the waste disposal grounds may do so during the hours outlined in Schedule "A"; the garbage is to be deposited in the location specified by the operation of the waste disposal grounds.
18. Any licensed contractor wanting to haul garbage or refuse to the waste disposal grounds may do so during the hours outlined in Schedule "A" or by making arrangements with the Town Administrator to haul during hours other than those indicated in Schedule "A".
19. A charge as set out in Schedule "B" attached hereto, will be made for every vehicle entering the Indian Head Waste Disposal Grounds.
20. Paragraphs 16 and 18 herein shall not apply to employees of the Town of Indian Head who may have to go to the waste disposal grounds in the hours of their employment with the Town.
21. No person, other, than employees for the Town of Indian Head, shall burn any refuse or material at the waste disposal grounds.

22. No person other than a resident of the Town of Indian Head or a resident of the Rural Municipality of Indian Head #156 may haul refuse or garbage from their premises to the Indian Head Waste Disposal Grounds or is a person or contractor employed by a resident of the Town of Indian Head or by a resident of the Rural Municipality of Indian Head #156, to haul garbage or refuse from their premises to the Indian Head Waste Disposal Grounds.
23. If any person fails, neglects or refuses to comply with this bylaw, remedial action may be carried out by the Council at the expense of the person in default and the local governing authority may recover expenses incurred by action in any court of competent jurisdiction or through municipal taxes.
- a) Every person who contravenes any provision of this bylaw or fails to comply therewith is guilty of an offense and liable on summary conviction to the penalty prescribed in this section.
- b) An individual who commits an offense is liable:
- i) For a first offense, to a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 and to further fine of not more than \$50.00 for each day during which the offense continues;
- ii) For a second offense or a subsequent offense, to a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 and to further fine of not more than \$50.00 for each day during which the offense continues.
- c) A corporation which commits an offense is liable:
- i) For a first offense, to a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 and to a further fine of not more than \$500.00 for each day during which the offense continues;
- ii) For a second or subsequent offense, to a fine of not more than \$10,000.00 and to a further fine of not more than \$500.00 for each day during which the offense continues.

24. This bylaw shall come into force on the day of final approval by the Minister of Environment and Resource Management.

25. Bylaw No. 15--1990 is hereby repealed.

SCHEDULE "A" TO BYLAW 2--1994

HOURS OF OPERATION

1. The waste disposal grounds will be open to the public from April 1 to October 31, during the following hours:

- a. Sundays - 1:00 p.m. to 4 p.m.
- b. Mondays - 1:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- c. Tuesdays - 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- d. Wednesdays - 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- e. Thursdays - 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- f. Fridays - 1:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- g. Saturdays - 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

SCHEDULE "B" TO BYLAW NO. 2--1994

CHARGES FOR DISPOSAL OF REFUSE & GARBAGE

1. For each vehicle entering the waste disposal grounds for the purpose of unloading "Household Garbage or Refuse" there shall be a charge as follows:

2. For each vehicle entering the waste disposal grounds for the purpose of unloading "Demolition Material" there shall be a charge as follows:
