

TOWN OF INDIAN HEAD

BYLAW NO. 3--2019

A BYLAW TO PERMIT THE OPERATION OF ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWN OF INDIAN HEAD.

All Terrain Vehicles means a self-propelled vehicle that:

- a) is designed primarily of the movement of people or goods on unprepared surfaces; and
- b) has wheels in contact with the ground; and includes:
- c) a restricted use motorcycle;
- d) a mini-bike; and
- e) an all terrain cycle

The Council of the Town of Indian Head in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. Under the provisions of *The All Terrain Vehicle Act*, All Terrain Vehicles may be operated between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. on any street within the limits of the Town of Indian Head.
2. All Terrain Vehicles shall leave the town limits using only the most direct route and returning to a residence by the most direct route unless the operator of the All Terrain Vehicle is performing one of the following acts:
 - i) Removing snow from streets, lanes, driveways or parking lots
 - ii) Spraying lots with a pesticide, if the All Terrain Vehicle is being operated by a licensed pesticide applicator
 - iii) Taking part in a parade, ceremony or special occasion
3. No person shall operate an All Terrain Vehicle within the Town of Indian Head in such a manner as to create a nuisance or undue annoyance to residents or other persons in the Town.
4. No person shall operate an All Terrain Vehicle upon any property in such a manner that is dangerous to other persons or property.
5. No person shall operate an All Terrain Vehicle to travel two (2) abreast on a street.
6. No person shall operate an All Terrain Vehicle who is under the age of sixteen (16) years.
7. No person shall operate an All Terrain Vehicle without a valid Class 7 driver's license or higher.
8. All Terrain Vehicles while driving in the Town of Indian Head must not exceed 30 kilometers per hour and must operate in a safe and courteous manner.
9. No person shall operate an All Terrain Vehicle at night without using prescribed lights.
10. The operator of and any passenger on an All Terrain Vehicle that is being operated shall wear a helmet and protection for the eyes of the type and in the manner prescribed.
11. No person shall operate an All Terrain Vehicle on:
 - a) a highway, whether traveled or untraveled portion of it;
 - b) any public land;unless there is, in respect of the operation of the All Terrain Vehicle, a subsisting contract of automobile insurance within the meaning of Part VI of *The Saskatchewan Insurance Act* insuring the owner and every person who operates the vehicle in an amount of not less than the prescribed amount against liability imposed by law on the insured named in the contract or that other person for loss or damage:
 - a) resulting from the ownership, use or operation of the All Terrain Vehicle; and



b) resulting from the bodily injury to or the death of any person and damage to property.

12. Every person operating an All Terrain Vehicle on:

- a) a highway, whether the traveled or untraveled portion of it;
 - b) any public land;
- shall produce proof of financial responsibility as required by section 14 to any peace officer requesting that proof either at the time of the request or within forty-eight (48) hours, or any longer period of time as the peace officer may allow, at any time and place that may be designated by the peace officer making the request.

13. A person who contravenes the provisions of this Bylaw is guilty of an offense and liable upon summary conviction to a fine of not more than One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars and in default of payment to imprisonment for a term of not more than Thirty (30) days.

14. This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect on _____
